

	<p><u>Holy Lands (Israel / Palestine)</u>  Many visit the places where Jesus lived, especially during the Christian festivals (for example, Bethlehem, where he was born, at Christmas; Jerusalem, the place where he died, at Easter).</p>
	<p><u>St. Peter's Basilica, Rome</u>  St. Peter, disciple of Jesus and first <b>Bishop</b> of Rome, was <b>martyred</b> and believed to be buried here. It is the centre of the <b>Roman Catholic</b> church, and home of the Pope.</p>
	<p><u>Lourdes, France</u>  In 1858, a young girl called Bernadette Soubivous had a vision of Jesus' mother, Mary. The spring waters that flow from the fountains are believed to bring miraculous healing from God.</p>
	<p><u>Iona, Scotland</u>  In 530 AD St. Columba travelled from Ireland and landed at Iona to <b>convert</b> the people to Christianity. He started a <b>monastery</b> here.</p>
	<p><u>Santiago de Compostela, Spain</u>  Saint James, one of the twelve disciples of Jesus, is believed to be buried in the Cathedral.</p>
	<p><u>Canterbury (Cathedral), England</u>  Thomas Becket, <b>Archbishop</b> of Canterbury, was <b>martyred</b> here.</p>
	<p><u>St. David's, Wales</u>  Dewi Sant (St. David) lived here and helped spread the Christian faith in Wales.</p>
	<p><u>Walsingham, England</u>  In 1061 Richeldis de Faverches had a vision of Jesus' mother Mary and built a <b>replica</b> of the humble house where Jesus was born. An Augustine <b>Priory</b> was built there, and today there are <b>Roman Catholic</b> and <b>Anglican</b> shrines.</p>
	<p><u>Knock, Ireland</u>  On 21st August 1879 a group of people standing outside the church saw a heavenly vision there.</p>

## Glossary

Anglican	A type/style of church (denomination). Closely linked to the Church of England.
Archbishop	A Bishop of the highest rank.
Bishop	A high-ranking church leader. This term is normally used in the Anglican (Church of England), Roman Catholic and Greek Orthodox denominations.
convert	To persuade someone to adopt a particular religion or faith.
martyred	Someone who makes great sacrifices or suffers for their beliefs. This term is most often used to refer to people who die for their beliefs.
monastery	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. a religious community living in isolation from the world</li><li>2. the building(s) these communities live in.</li></ol>
Pope	The Bishop of Rome, head of the Roman Catholic Church.
priory	A type of monastery
replica	A copy or reproduction
Roman Catholic	A type/style of church (denomination) who's leader is the Pope.
