Message from Mrs Bacon

Welcome to the first newsletter of 2024, it has been an incredibly busy start to the new year and it is a very short half term – lots to fit in.

All staff spent the INSET day working and training for a whole school approach to phonics. It has been a great and encouraging approach, as all staff are able to understand and support the drive to improve our children's outcomes in reading. Our overarching focus has been: **Learning to read, so you can read to learn** —which I have shared with the children — we want all children to be confident and keen readers.

We continue to drive and tweak our approach to the library – giving children free choice to choose library books is so important for their development – learning to choose books that they like, finding authors they don't like etc. We have an amazing selection of books, please encourage your children to choose books on their library day and maybe try and find the opportunity to enjoy their books with them.

Great to see your continued support with attendance at Learning Cafes – as a working mum myself, I know it is not possible for all but please check Google Classroom for information shared. We also had a great turnout for the Parent Workshop and have taken some feedback which we have shared with the facilitators – we will try and make the next one even better. Slides will be shared on Google Classroom for all.

Little Wandle Letters and Sounds

As many of you would have recently experienced at our Learning Cafes, we've introduced the Little Wandle systematic synthetic phonics scheme at St Michael's. This engaging programme ensures a dynamic approach to early literacy, building robust foundations for your child's reading and writing skills. Whole School Music Project

We have continued our relationship with the Royal Opera House and Mr Barnardo has engaged with their CPD for the Opera – The Magic Flute by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart and Emanuel Schikaneder.
During this series of lessons the children will perform as part of an Opera Chorus, develop knowledge of the history of Opera, understand the dramatic singing, increase their awareness of vocal technique and gain the ability to make connections between and discuss performances. Full time Nursery Newsflash

As you may be aware, next year we are trialling full time nursery (9 - 3.30). Our admissions policy will remain the same. Please support us and let any friends or family know who might be considering St Michael's.

We have decided to see if we can extend this offer to our existing nursery class and will be sending out a google form this week to see if we have viable numbers interested for us to start this full time provision for the Summer Term. This provision will not only be open for families who are eligible for 30 hour funding; we will also offer a self-funding option for the extra 15 hours for the 5 afternoon sessions at a rate of approximately £6 an hour. There will be a £3 daily charge for all children to cover care at lunchtime and children will need to be provided with a packed lunch each day.

We are very excited about this new venture and we are really hoping that this will serve our local community and existing families better.
